Market and political certainty

A majority of the Swedish Parliament have this year agreed on a transition to an entirely renewable electricity system, with a target of 100 per cent renewable electricity production by 2040.

The expansion of renewable energy will continue. Sweden has fantastic conditions for wind power – both on- and offshore. The electricity certificate system will be extended and expanded by 18 TWh of new electricity certificates until 2030. The Swedish Wind Energy Association predict at least 15 TWh from wind production out of 18 TWh. 1500 windmills and investments equal to 4,7 billion Euros (45 billions SEK).

Off-shore Wind is becoming more compatible and the parliament have agreed to abolish the fees for marine-based wind power plants to connect to the national grid.

What is market reaction? Are these decisions enough? 50 % wind power in Sweden?
